THIS WEEK'S LESSON: THE BOOKS ABOUT JESUS!



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

The Gospels are the books that change the whole story of the Bible. Jesus has come to fulfill the prophecies, to pay the price for our sins, and set us free. John 3:16-17, Jesus Sums Up His Life's Mission



MANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask the kids to teach you the hand motions they learned to help them remember the Gospels. See if they can remember all of the books from the beginning.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What story do we find in the Gospels?
- Who wrote the four Gospels?
- Why does the Bible give us four versions of the same story?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

M PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:
